We Emphasize Fun

Our program is committed to understanding the unique problems that children with ADHD face, and helping these children develop social skills and self-esteem. Each day, children participate in a team sport and a skills drill, under the guidance of attentive and nurturing counselors. Daily activities also include art projects, swimming, academic and computer work in our learning centers, and social skills training.

Our Staff Make the Difference

Our superb counselors are advanced psychology undergraduate and graduate students who seek out these highly competitive positions. They are compassionate, extremely motivated, experienced in working with children, and are usually on a career path in the mental health or education fields. They participate in a month-long, all-day intensive training where they gain an understanding of children with special needs and master behavioral strategies that enable them to work effectively with campers. Highly qualified teachers lead the academic, computer, and art components of the program, and provide academic enrichment. All staff are regularly supervised by on-site clinical psychologists in order to optimize the child's summer experience and

to effect positive behavior change. Our ratio of one staff member for every one to two children enables the NYU Summer Program for Kids to make the summer a productive and fun experience for every child.

Parents as Partners

Parents are encouraged to attend weekly group training sessions throughout the seven-week program. Parents will learn effective behavior management techniques to improve compliance and promote independence and positive self-esteem in their child. We provide a supportive atmosphere where parents can share their experiences and develop skills and confidence in themselves as parents of children with special needs.

Location The NYU Summer Program for Kids is located in the Throgs Neck section of the Bronx on the beautiful campus of SUNY Maritime College in historic Fort Schuyler. Maritime College is a modern, well-maintained, secure facility with lovely grounds in a residential setting. Maritime's outdoor playing fields, indoor heated swimming pool, and indoor gymnasium provide excellent recreational facilities for our full sports program.

Transportation Transportation is provided from centrally located pick-up and drop-off points throughout the New York metropolitan area by fully licensed and insured bus companies.

Schedule Seven weeks, starting the last week of June, from 8:15 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Tuition \$9,300 for the seven-week summer session. Partial scholarships are available to eligible families.

Since this is a clinical treatment program, insurance companies may provide partial tuition reimbursement. In order to ensure your child receives the individualized care and attention s/he deserves, the program size is limited.

Enrollment The application process includes a clinical assessment to determine eligibility and suitability of the program for your child.

Director

Karen Fleiss, Psy.D., is Assistant Professor of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and the Clinical Director of the NYU Child Study Center Long Island Campus. Since the launch of the Summer Program for Kids in 1997, she has successfully operated and expanded the program. Dr. Fleiss is a nationally renowned clinician with extensive expertise diagnosing and treating children with behavioral and social issues and proficiency in behavior management and parent training.

Scientific Advisor

Howard Abikoff, Ph.D., the Pevaroff Cohn Professor of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, is a leading researcher and the Director of the Institute for Attention Deficit Hyperactivity and Behavior Disorders at the NYU Child Study Center. Dr. Abikoff consults with the staff throughout the summer and provides additional oversight for your child.
