

Child and Adolescent Mental Health Studies (CAMS) Minor Non-departmental Approved Courses

In order to complete the CAMS minor, students must take five courses. At least three of these courses must be selected from amongst the offerings of the CAMS Minor itself within the NYU Department of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry (NYU Child Study Center). The remaining two courses can also be CAMS courses or may be taken in other departments (ranging from three to six points each). Courses have been identified within both the College of Arts and Science and the Steinhardt School of Education which serve the mission of the CAMS Minor. Courses taken for the CAMS Minor cannot be applied to another major or minor without prior approval from the Directors of Undergraduate Studies of each department (e.g., no “double-dipping” is allowed), and the converse is also true; such that courses taken to complete another college major or minor cannot be applied to the CAMS Minor without prior approval.
